THE VOICE OF THE PASTOR

Dear Fathers, Brothers and Sisters,

No one wants to suffer in the world, but on the contrary everyone wants to lead a cosy and comfortable life in the world. The way of Christ is contrary to the thinking of the humans. In Jesus we have a perfect model for obedient suffering. This thought is very well expressed by St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians: "Jesus humbled himself and



became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name" (Phil.2:8-9). If Jesus died, we have to die with him to follow him and enter into eternal life. The Imitation of Christ necessarily implies that we follow him both in his suffering and glory. Because as Christians we have no other way than that of Jesus. He says emphatically "If anyone want to become my flowers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me" (Mk.8:34). From the words of Jesus, it is very clear that we must accept suffering for the sake of Jesus.

Let us not be under the false impression that we are suffering all alone, but Christ is with us in our suffering. Our love for Christ gives a meaning to our suffering. By suffering we participate in the redemptive work of Christ. Jesus is our model and example in all our sufferings. If we imitate Christ in our suffering in humility and obedience, then our life will take on a new meaning and Christ will be with us as a source of strength to put up with the sufferings. Such a patience will pave the way for our eternal life.

Pope's Lenten Message 2021

"Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem ..." (Mt 20:18). Lent: time to renew faith, hope and charity.



Dear brothers and sisters,

announcing his passion, death and resurrection to his disciples, in fulfillment of the Father's will, Jesus reveals to them the profound meaning of his mission and calls them to associate with it, for the salvation of the world.


As we walk the Lenten journey, which leads us towards the Easter celebrations, we remember the One who "humbled himself by making himself obedient to death and death on the cross" (*Phil* 2 : 8). In this time of conversion we renew *our faith*, draw *the "living water" of hope* and receive with an open heart *the love of God* which transforms us into brothers and sisters in Christ. On Easter night we will renew the promises of our Baptism, to be reborn new men and women, thanks to the work of the Holy Spirit. But already the itinerary of Lent, like the entire Christian journey, is all under the light of the Resurrection, which animates the feelings, attitudes and choices of those who want to follow Christ.

Fasting, prayer and almsgiving, as they are presented by Jesus in his preaching (cf. Mt 6: 1-18), are the conditions and the expression of our conversion. The way of poverty and deprivation (fasting), the gaze and gestures of love for the wounded man (almsgiving) and filial dialogue with the Father (prayer) allow us to embody a sincere faith, a hope alive and an active charity.

1. Faith calls us to welcome the Truth and to become witnesses to it, before God and before all our brothers and sisters. In this time of Lent, welcoming and living the Truth manifested in Christ means first of all letting ourselves be reached by the Word of God, which is transmitted to us, from generation to generation, by the Church. This Truth is not a construction of the intellect, reserved for a few chosen, superior or distinct minds, but it is a message that we receive and can understand thanks to the intelligence of the heart, open

to the greatness of God who loves us before we ourselves take it. consciousness. This Truth is Christ himself, who assuming our humanity to the end became the Way - demanding but open to all - which leads to the fullness of Life.

Fasting lived as an experience of privation leads those who live it in simplicity of heart to rediscover the gift of God and to understand our reality as creatures in his image and likeness, which find fulfillment in him. Experiencing an accepted poverty, those who fast make themselves poor with the poor and "accumulate" the richness of love received and shared. Understood and practiced in



Lent is a time to believe, that is, to receive God in our life and allow him to "take up residence" with us (cf. Jn14:23). Fasting means freeing our existence from what encumbers it, even from the saturation of information - true or false - and consumer products, to open the doors of our heart to the One who comes to us poor in everything, but "full of grace and of truth" (Jn 1:14): the Son of God the Savior.

2. Hope as "living water" that allows us to continue our journey

The Samaritan woman, from whom Jesus asks for a drink at the well, does not understand when He tells her that he could offer her "living water" (Jn 4:10). At the beginning she naturally thinks of material water, Jesus instead means the Holy Spirit, what He will give in abundance in the Paschal Mystery and who instills in us the hope that does not disappoint. Already in announcing his passion and death, Jesus announces hope, when he says: "and on the third day he will rise again" (Mt20.19). Jesus speaks to us of the future opened up by the Father's mercy. Hoping with him and thanks to him means believing that history does not end with our errors, our violence and injustices and the sin that crucifies Love. It means drawing the forgiveness of the Father from his open Heart.

In the current context of concern in which we live and in which everything seems fragile and uncertain, talking about hope could seem like a provocation. The time of Lent is made for hope, to return to turn

our gaze to the patience of God, who continues to take care of his Creation, while we have often mistreated it (cf. Enc. *Laudatosi* ', 32-33.43-44). It is hope in reconciliation, to which St. Paul urges us with passion: "Be reconciled with God" (2 Cor5.20). By receiving forgiveness, in the Sacrament that is at the heart of our conversion process, we in turn become spreaders of forgiveness: having received it ourselves, we can offer it through the ability to live a thoughtful dialogue and by adopting a behavior that comforts those who are hurt. God's forgiveness, also through our words and our gestures, allows us to live an Easter of fraternity.


In Lent, we are more careful to "say words of encouragement, which comfort, which give strength, which console, which stimulate, instead of words which humiliate, which sadden, which irritate, which despise" (Enc. *Fratellitutti* [FT], 223). Sometimes, to give hope, it is enough to be "a kind person, who puts aside his concerns and urgencies to pay attention, to give a smile, to say a word of stimulus, to make a space for listening in between to so much indifference "(*ibid.*, 224).

In recollection and silent prayer, hope is given to us as inspiration and interior light, which illuminates the challenges and choices of our mission: this is why it is essential to gather together to pray (cf. Mt 6:6) and to meet, in secret, the Father of tenderness.

Living a Lent with hope means feeling that, in Jesus Christ, we are witnesses of the new time, in which God "makes all things new" (cf. Rev 21,1-6). It means receiving the hope of Christ who gives his life on the cross and that God rises on the third day, "always ready to answer whoever asks [us] about the hope that is in [us]" (1 Pt 3,15).

3. Charity, lived in the footsteps of Christ, in attention and compassion for each one, is the highest expression of our faith and our hope.

Charity rejoices in seeing the other grow. This is why he suffers when the other is in anguish: alone, sick, homeless, despised, in need... Charity is the impulse of the heart that makes us come out of ourselves and that generates the bond of sharing and communion.



called. Charity, with its universal dynamism, can build a new world, because it is not a sterile sentiment, but the best way to reach effective paths of development for all "(FT, 183).



Charity is a gift that gives meaning to our life and thanks to which we consider those who suffer privation as a member of our own family, friend, brother. The little, if shared with love, never ends, but is transformed into a reserve of life and happiness. So it happened with the flour and oil of the widow of Sarepta, who offers the cake to the prophet Elijah (cf. 1 Kings 17:7-16); and for the

loaves that Jesus blesses, breaks and gives to the disciples to distribute to the crowd (cf. *Mk* 6: 30-44). So it happens for our alms, whether small or large, offered with joy and simplicity.

Living a Lent of charity means taking care of those who are in conditions of suffering, abandonment or distress due to the Covid-19 pandemic. In the context of great uncertainty about tomorrow, reminding us of the word addressed by God to his Servant: "Do not be afraid, for I have redeemed you" (*Is* 43,1), we offer with our charity a word of trust, and we make the other heard that God loves him like a son.

"Only with a gaze whose horizon is transformed by charity, which leads him to grasp the dignity of the other, are the poor recognized and appreciated in their immense dignity, respected in their own style and culture, and therefore truly integrated into the society "(FT, 187).

Dear brothers and sisters, every stage of life is a time to believe, hope and love. This call to live Lent as a path of conversion, prayer and sharing of our goods, help us to revisit, in our community and personal memory, the faith that comes from the living Christ, hope animated by the breath of the Spirit and love it. whose inexhaustible source is the merciful heart of the Father.

May Mary, Mother of the Savior, faithful at the foot of the cross and in the heart of the Church, support us with her caring presence, and may the blessing of the Risen One accompany us on the journey towards the Easter light.



Historical Notes – *Madura* **Mission**

XIIL On the Footsteps of our Elder Brothers

Fr. Pudumai: Fr. Savari Pudumai hailed from Singamparai village of Palayamkottai Diocese. Frs. Jeganathan and Dhivyanandam say that when Fr. Pudumai was working as a Tamil Teacher at Suranam, there came to him marriage proposals; but perceiving and obeying the inner Call, he decided to serve God as a Priest. He left his Teaching post and joined the Seminary. Though his vocation came late in his life, his whole priestly life became an early inspiration to so many Seminarians who passed through the portals of St. Peter's Seminary, Pudur – Viraganur. Here is a priest who totally dedicated his life for the Seminarians, the future priests of Madurai, Sivagangai, Trichy, and Palayamkottai.

Fr. Jeganathan says that it is very simple to find out the whereabout of this saintly priest. He could be found only in three places! i) chapel ii) Class room iii) or his room. His whole life was divided in the above mentioned places for three purposes: for his personal prayer life; for his ministry of spiritual animation of Seminarians and finally for Teaching. Many of the Priests of the above mentioned dioceses would surely remember the concern and care with which the saintly priest taught Lain and English at St. Peter's. After Fr. Dhanasamy SJ., he became the Rector of St. Peter's sometimes.

Most of those priets would vouchsafe to the fact of his benevolence. While there had been terrifying English professors and strict Rector at St. Peter's, Fr. Pudumai's presence at the Seminary was always a consoling and encouraging one to the broken hearted and dejected Seminarians. He would always comfort and console those seminarians who were not able to come up to the level of academic and spiritual standard laid out by the Seminary. He used to give some edibles taken from Bishop's house refectory to the poor seminarians. One could see a couple of patches of cloths stitched on his torn Cassock. He used to mend his own cassocks. Though he was a Professor in the Minor Seminary one can not see stacks of Books in his room. He had on his table the Bible, the Brievary and a couple of others. Fr. Jeganathan says

that he had also only one photo on his table, that of the Catechist of Singamparai who taught him the faith and trained him at his early age.

He was very strict to observe and follow the rules for himself but he was kind to all whoever came to him for some spiritual guidance. Those days Seminarians had to wear a white dothi and a full handed White Shirt. When the Seminarians went out once a week for ministry he used to advice them to exercise modesty. "When you go out also", he exhorted, "show yourself that you are the follower of Christ".

Fr. Jeganathan recalls that Fr. Jeyabalan, Antony Muthu, Fr. John Siluvai, Fr. Arockiasamy, Bishop Susaimanickam having clothed in white full hand shirts and dhoties studied at Colleges. Later they all studied with him in St. Peter's where a thorough Training on English and Latin were provided. He earns for such training to the present seminarians now.

Fr. Pudumai's life was marked with a special devotion to our Blessed Mother and St. Francis Xavier, his patron Saint. When St. Peter's was shifted to Viraganur from Pudur for the reason that the Seminarians were disturbed with the hustle and bustle of Bishop's House and pastoral center activities, Fr. Pudumai continued his sacred ministries at Viraganur as well. For so many years he was suffering from a hunched neck. Bearing all the pains for Christ he was living as a 'walking Saint' at the buildings of St. Peter's Seminary. Finally the Lord took him to himself on 6-9-1992 in order to crown him with the crown of Conquerer (Rev. 2,7).

We can sum up the priestly life of this saintly priest as a crown adorned with three jewels, namely Humility, Dedication, Kindness. Long live the saintly name of Fr. Pudumai.

Fr. Joseph Xavier: Fr. Joseph Xavier was born on 28 March 1932 at MelaMeygnanapuram of Palayamkottai Diocese. He was an able administrator. He completed his Priestly studies at St. Paul's Trichy. He was ordained in 1957.

He ministered in different parishes and was loved by the faithful in all the parishes where he ministered. He was Parish Priest of Devakottai (1965-1968); of Susaiapparpattanam (68-75); and of Holy Rosary Church, Madurai (1976-1981). A very pious priest, good orator and a

courageous administrator who also moved the church towards its growth against all political pressures. Three noteworthy aspects of ministries



are to be recorded here. i) He is the one Give who built Hr. Sec. School at Susaiapparpattanam and brought the sisters to administer the School;

ii) Fr. Dhivyanandam says that he is the pioneer of St. Pius X petit Seminary. When he was in Devakottai he asked

Archbishop Diraviam to start a separate Seminary for the Diocesan clergy lest they were formed by the Jesuits at their Apostolic School, St. Mary's, Madurai. In sixties seminarians for the diocese were recruited and trained at St. Mary's apostolic School by the Jesuits. At that time of diocesans being considered incompetent of administering Seminaries, it is Fr. Joseph Xavier who dared to start the diocesan seminary. He started Pius X Seminary adjacent to the Orphanage, Karunailllam of Ramnagar, Devakottai and applied Subsidy for the Seminarians at Devakottai. Then Archbishop Diraviam asked him to shift the Seminary from Karunailllam to Madurai, Bishop's House so that better formation could be given to the Seminarians at the center. It was shifted to Pudur and later to Gnannaolivupuram.

iii) At Holy Rosary Church parish, Madurai, Fr. Joseph Xavier courageously threw away all the illegal tenants of the shops who were stiff-necked and demolished the old shopping complex over a night and built with much audacity the present Shopping Complex. It was a huge and courageous task to evacuate the belligerent tenants who did not pay the rents for so many years and who threatened the ownership of the Archdiocese.

When he was ministering at Holy rosary Church parish he was suffering from liver dis-function disease and he was admitted in CMC Vellur where he succumbed to the illness and reached the heavenly abode on 8 - 8- 1981. May the courageous name of Fr. Francis Xavier be praised for ever. (to be continued) (More soldiors are to come...)
